Releasing hands (hold R hands just long enough to assist W as she turns R half around to face reverse LOD), sixteen walking steps fwd (M in LOD, W reverse).

Part III (Music B)

17-20

RIGHT-HAND TURN a new ptr -- the nearest one at this time, and if you do not find one immediately look more carefully.

21 - 24

LEFT-HAND TURN the same person.

Part IV (Music B)

25-32

SWING new ptr.

Note: Skipping steps may be used.

RIGHT-HAND TURN: Join R hands -- palm to palm or hands clasped (thumb grip also possible), forearms touching to the elbows -- and turn CCW with walking steps. LEFT-HAND TURN: Same, except with L hand, turning CW.

Note: This recreational mixer was introduced in 1948 by A. J. Hildenbrand of Hamburg; it has since become very popular.
