Music: There is no commercial recording of this dance available.

The figures of this dance were given to me by Mr. John DeHaan, a musician from the Gronigen section of the Netherlands, as noted in his music scrap book. The music is practically the same as that in the Ling Collection, but the figures differ considerably. Mr. DeHaan says that the dance was also popular in neighboring areas of Germany at the time he played in that section. (During the 1920's)

Formation: Man and two ladies, hands joined in a circle.

With hands joined in circle (shoulder high) take 12 running steps in a clockwise direction
