SNURRBÖCKEN

(Sweden)

The name of the dance translates either as "whirl and bow" or "whirling billy goat," allowing for all sorts of foolishness. The dance shows the rustic people poking fun at the rich during the bow figure.

SOURCE:

FORMATION:

Couples in shoulder-waist position scattered around floor.

Meas.

I. TURNING

"Left-foot polska" basic turning step (M: L, touch, R; W: both, R, L) 8 basic steps, 8 full turns moving fwd in LOD.

II. RUNNING

Break from shoulder-waist pos by releasing ML, WR arm pos, (keep MR arm around W waist, WR at M shoulder) and run fwd in LOD with 3 steps per meas. (Beginning with stamp on first count). End facing ptnr, M inside.

III. BOWS

- 1,2 Large semi-serious bow to ptnr.
 - 3 Turn CCW with 3 steps to face out (back to back with ptnr).

4 Bow again, away from ptnr.

With 3 steps turn back to face ptnr and take shoulder-waist pos to repeat entire dance.

NOTE: The delsbopolska, or left-foot polska, is very fast and is done with a bounce on each count; no dip, as in a Hambo.
