## TARINA DE LA ABRUD

## (Romania)

Pronounced: Tsah-ree-nah deh-lah-Ah-brood

Tarina means dust or ashes; de la means from; and Abrud is a town in Southwestern Transylvania. The dance was learned from Mihai David, formerly with the Romanian Folk Ballet, who is now a resident of Los Angeles, California.

Music: Record (45): THE LARK: Romanian Dances, MD-3701, Side B, Band 2, "Țarina de la Abrud"

Closed circle of M and W with hands joined, held at Formation: shoulder level, and somewhat outstretched.

Steps and Figure I has a ballroom elegance whereas Figure II has a down-to-earth (tarina) quality. All stamps are without wt. Styling:

Meas Pattern

No Introduction.

WALK AND PIVOT

Moving fwd twd ctr, step R (ct 1), step L (ct 2). 1 2 Step R (ct 1). Releasing hands but keeping them up, pivot CCW on R while closing L to R without wt (ct 2).

Rejoin hands with neighbors and repeat action meas 1-2 3-4 twd outside of circle with opp ftwork and turning CW on ct 2.

Repeat action of meas 1-4 three more times (4 times in all). 5-16

> STAMPING II.

Step R in place (ct 1), stamp L (ct &). 1 Step L in place (ct 2), stamp R (ct &).

Step R sdwd to R (ct 1), step L across in back of R (ct &). Step R sdwd to R (ct 2), step L across in back of R (ct &).

Repeat action of Figure II, meas 1-2. 3 - 4

Repeat action of Figure II, meas 1 only, two more times. 5-6

Repeat action of Figure II, meas 2.

Step R sdwd to R (ct 1), stamp L beside R (ct &).

Stamp L beside R (ct 2), hold (ct &).

Repeat action of Figure II, meas 1-8 to L with opp ftwork 9-16

> Repeat entire dance from beginning. Presented by Walter Grothe
