METER: 3/4

FORMATION: Non-partner. Dancers form a closed circle with hands down.

1-8		INTRODUCTION: Stand in place during the first eight meas. of music.
		I. CIRCLE/IN and OUT:
1-4	1-12	Starting with the R foot, do four waltz steps to the R (LOD).
5-6	1-6	Move to center of the circle starting with the R foot and do two waltz steps forward.
7-8	1-6	Move back to the original circle with two waltz steps starting with the R.
9-16		Repeat Meas. 1-8 to the L (RLOD) still starting with the R foot.
		II WAAVEC.

#### II. <u>WAVES</u>:

- 1-3 HIGH WAVES: Facing center, step R to R and rock toward R foot. Hands go up high with palms facing center and sway the hands to the R.
- Rock back on to L foot with hands swaying to L. 1-3

3-4 Repeat Meas. 1-2.

Turning R and starting with the R foot, do four waltz steps making a small CW circle to end 7-8 1-12

in original place in the circle. The R wrist rolls from the waist forward with the R hand open in front of the body during each waltz step on the R. The L wrist rolls from the waist forward with the L hand open in front of the body during each waltz step on the L.

LOW WAVES: The footwork is the same as in the High Waves except the hands are 9-16 down during this step.
