CICERENNELLA (Italian)

This is probably the best-known of all tarantellas, a group of dances characterized by the fast tempo and exhausting steps -- in old legend, supposedly caused by the poisonous bite of the tarantula. This is a dance for two couples; couples face each other, men on same side.
