	PART I Seven little grapevine steps to the R as follows: RF, L behind RF, RF, LF in front of RF, RF, LF behind RF. R hop with slight kick fwd of LF during final hop. Seven little grapevine steps to L, as above, but with opposite footwork (leading with LF, etc). Repeat Meas 1-8.
2-2 3-4 3-6 7	PART II Step RF to R, LF behind RF, R hop, kicking LF a bit fwd on hop. Repeat meas 1-2, only with opposite footwork and direction. Repeat meas 1-2. Noving fwd, step on L ft fwd (ct 1). Close and step on R ft next to L ft (ct 2). Step fwd on L ft (ct 1). Hop on L ft (ct 2).
