

# GAITANAKI RODOU

Greece (Dodecanese Is.)
(Line dance, no partners)

Translation: Gaitanáki (a type of braiding), from the island of Rhodes.

Record: Folkraft 1466x45B.

Starting Position: Front chain position. Right foot free. Braid hands with L hand over neighbor's right.

### PART I (Music A)

#### Measure

- 1-3 Facing slightly and moving right, three walking steps (right, left, right) turning on last step to face slightly left (counts 1-3).

  Facing slightly and moving left, three walking steps (left, right, left) turning on last step to face center (counts 4-6).
- A quick STEP-TOUCH (right) forward (counts 1-and),
  A quick STEP-CLOSE sideward left (count 2-and).

- 5 A quick STEP-TOUCH (left) backward (counts 1-and), A quick STEP-CLOSE sideward right (counts 2-and).
- 6 Step sideward right on right foot (count 1), Turning to face slightly and moving right, step forward on left foot (count 2).
- 7-12 REPEAT pattern of measures 1-6. Finish facing center.

### PART II (Music B)

- Two quick STEP-TOUCHES sideward (right, left) (counts 1-and, 2-and).
- 14-16 REPEAT pattern of Part I measures 4-6.
- 17-20 REPEAT pattern of measures 13-16.

STEP-TOUCH (Right), Quick: Step on right foot (count 1), close and touch left foot beside right without taking weight (count and). Repeat, reversing footwork, for Quick Step-Touch (Left).

STEP-CLOSE (Right), Quick: Step on right foot (count 1), close and step on left foot beside right (count and). Repeat, reversing footwork, for Quick Step-Close (Left).

My braiding is being woven
