M & W in open circle, hands joined at shidr height "W" pos.
Everybody close to neighbrs. Leader at L of line. Everyone

DESCRIPTION

	I BASIC FIGURE
1	Step on L ft to L (1) step on R ft to L (2)
2	Step on L to L (1) step on R to L (8) step on L to L (2)
3	Step on R to L (1) step on L to L (2)
4	Step on R to L'(1) small hop on R ft in place, simult. raising L ft crossed in front of R (2)
5-16	Repeat above figure three more times
	II HEEL-CLICKS
17	Facing ctr, and bringing arms down at sides, two small hops on R ft, travelling slightly to L and simult. "clicking" inner L ft on outer R (1-2) Knees are slightly bent here and feet are close to ground. It is not a "Polish-style" heel click
18	Facing L, small running step onto L to L (1)
19	change weight sharply onto L ft, simultaneously kicking
20	R ft sharply diag. fwd R (2) Small leap bkwd onto R ft (1) bring L ft around sharply and "click" it against R as in meas 17 (2)
	Dance repeats from beg. and alternates as above.
