Fig. I With arms folded across chest and wil lifted, with 8 two-steps men dance around the girls. He passes in front of partner by right shoulder, around the lady in the set <u>behind</u> him. (Hee comes around her from behind) As he goes around her he passes her by the left should and back to his wwn place.

This pattern is a figure 8. The girls clap.

Fig. II In a two-couple circle and with arms well streched, dance hopped Polka steps to the left. Take ballroom position and dance back to place with 8 turning Polka steps.

Fig. III Give both hands to partner. With men's left foot and women's right, dance a heel, toe each foot. Turn once with two Polka steps moving to the right. Repeat three more times. You will move \( \frac{1}{2} \) around the set each time, till you are home. Begin from the beginning.
