- lyrical and fluent character in the movements

- dipping movements coming from the anckle and knee joints Characteristic for this dance is the 5 bar *Pravo* pattern in Part 1. Another typical feature of the dances from Haskovo are the fluent movements combined with abrupt small stamps and pauses, also for the




