This particular Finnish folk dance is interesting because of its similarity in step patterns and melody of musical accompaniment to a Russian folk dance in different title. The music is definitely Russian in quality with its minor mode and a certain nostalgic feeling characteristic of many Slavic dances. These similarities, however, are not surprising when one refers to the map showing the proximity of Finland and Russia with boundary lines which introduce few if any barriers to an interchange of folkways.

Figures I, II, and IV are danced with a smooth, subtle quality while Fig. III is more spirited in quality and accented with stamps as indicated.
