PRONUNCIATION: krahs-NAH-yah deh-VEE-tsah

RECORD: Russian Mosaic (Russian Folk Songs), side 2, band 3

FORMATION: 2 lines of an even number of W opposite eachother.

Each line faces diag R, with hands in "W" pos. During meas 7-12, two W work tog as a cpl. W #1 is to R of W

INTRODUCTION: Beg with singing

DANCE:

- 1-6 Beg R, walk 12 steps twd R.
- Releasing hands beg R, do a 6 step do-si-do, modified: W #1 turns 1/2 CW (R) in place with first 2 steps to pass W #2 by the R shldr to do the do-si-do. W #2 does a regular do-si-do. End face-to-face with ptr (#1 W faces L, #2 twd R), in this pos ptrs join both arms straight across with hands on ptrs elbow.
- 10--12 Beg R, cpls turn CW with 5 steps + close L to R without wt. End in original pos in a line.

Rejoin hands in "W" pos, and repeat dance from beg with opp ftwk and moving twds L. W #1 does movements of #2, and W #2 does movments of #1.

Repeat dance from beg, alternating ftwk, direction and turns.
