KRIVA KRUSKA

Yugoslavia

Kriva Kruska (KREE-vah KRUSH-kah) is from the ethnographic region of Central Moravia (see map). The title has reference to the dance pattern which is like a "crooked pear." Vonnie R. Brown learned the dance in Yugoslavia in 1985 from Dragan M. Paunović.

MUSIC:	Tape cassette - Dances From Yugoslavia, Vonnie R. Brown and Dragan M. Paunović 2/4
FORMATION:	Open circle or line of dancers facing diag to R, hands joined down in "V" pos.
STEPS and STYLING:	The dance is done very light-footed; the steps are small and done on flat feet.
MUSIC 2/4	PATTERN

	INTRODUCTION. No action.
1-8	The dance may beg immediately or wait 8 meas and then beg.
	TRAVELING STEP
1	Facing slightly diag R of ctr and moving in LOD, leap fwd on ball of R ft, rather flat-footed (ct 1); step fwd on flat L ft so ft are together but L ft is slightly fwd of L (ct 4); repeat cts 1 4 (cts 2 4). Note: slight up-down feeling on leap step.
2	Repeat meas 1, cts 1 & 2 for a total of 7 small, quick steps (cts 1 & 2); hold (ct &).
	CRNTER STEP

CENTER STEP

- Facing ctr, leap sdwd L on L ft (ct 1); cross R in front of L ft (ct &); leap sdwd L on L ft, turning body to R 45° and tucking R ft near L ankle (ct 2); hold (ct &).
- 4 Repeat meas 3 with opp ftwk and direction.
- Leap onto L ft in place, tucking R ft near L ankle (ct 1); leap onto R ft in place, tucking L ft near R ankle (ct 2).
- 6 Repeat meas 3.
- 7 Repeat meas 4.
- 8 Repeat meas 3.
