Northern European Folk Dances

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Selected for the 1977 Lighted Lantern Folk Dance Camp, July 24-30 1977.

My father who has been dancing since the 1920s recently gave me his collection of 10" 78's, some of them museum pieces with no lead-in groove! So I've decided to share with you some of these gems which delighted me years ago. Mixed in with them are some Bavarian dances from a planned folk-fest in Burghausen at which about 1% were not natives. Finally, I've been teaching Scottish Country Dancing for the last few years so I'll present a few of the more intricate of these for you.

ATRIP TO BAVARIA (from J. Lomath, 1976) SCOTTISH COUNTRY DANCE

The Trip (For the trip there are two kin dancers: Insiders, pos 2 & 3, and Outsiders pos

Outsiders turn partner $\frac{1}{2}$, while Insider dance ½ wheel. All use R hands.

Now on the sides, each dancer changes places with the person (same sex) on earest corner using L hands. Former Outsiders are now Insiders and v.v. ift on the sides

Repeat bars 1-4 three more times enling in 5-16 original places.

"Track"

17-18 Cpls & 2 face diagonally, set(pas-de-basque) 19-20 Cpl 1: 2 sk-ch-st to pos 2, improver (w prec. m) Cpl 2: 2 sk-ch-st to pos 1.

Cpls 1 & 3 set diagonally (to same sex)
Cpl 1: 2 sk-ch-st to pos 3, proper (w prec. m)
Cpl 3: 2 k-ch-st to pos 1. 23-24

25-28 Cpls 1 & Arepeat bars 17-20 All have moved up one place but Cpl is improper, at the bottom of the set.

29-32 Join hands on the sides, advance with 2 sk-ch-

st & retire with 2 sk-ch-st, except for Cpl 1, who advance with 1 sk-ch-st and turn with 1 pas-de-basque then retare with their lines.

The dance is repeated 3 more times.

2. THE REEL OF THE 51st DIVISION (Scottid) TUNE The Drunken Pipe any good or 407 FIME 4/4 pipe tune

This is a longways reel-time dance for 3 couples. A new top couple begins on severy 3rd repetition.

1-8 1st couple set to each other, and then east off two places on their own sides of the dance, They meet below 3rd couple, and 1st man leads his partner up the middle to place her facing her 1 1st corner. corner, he turning to face his

1st couple of to 1st corners 2 pas de basque. They tun corner joining light hands—2 skip charge of step—and, stil holding right hand of 1st corners, give left halds to partner, making a diagonal line across the dance. 9-16 1st couple,



18-14 All set in line. Q pas de basque.

1st couple, dropping hand, of 1st corners, turn each other with left hands to face 2nd corners. 2 skip change of step.

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They repeat all this with 2nd orner, but, in tead of turning each other in the last two steps, they cross over to own side one place

25-82 1st, 2nd and 3rd couples make a circle, and dance 8 slip step round to the left and 8 back again, fipsing on their own sides of dance one place dov

1st couple repeat since with next couples.

NOTE

This dance was composed in a P.O.W. Camp in Germany, by two Highland Officers of the 51st (Highland) Division, which was captured in 1940 at St. Valery.

THE MACHINE WITHOUT HORSES

TUNE Original

OF 4 TIME 6/8

This is a longways jig-time dance for 3 ncouples. A new top couple begins on every 3rd repelition.

1st couple set to each other, then east off one place on their own sides of the dance.

1st and 8rd couples, giving right hand scross to make a wheel, dance once round with wheels 4 skip change of step.

9-12 1st couple set to each other again, then cast up one into original places.

make a wheel, dance once right round. All are now back in original places.

17-24 1st couple, followed by 2nd couple, lead down Tasport the middle through 3rd couple, and cast up to the top. They then cast off into 2nd place, 2nd couple dancing up into top place. 8 skip change of step.



25-82 1st and 2nd couples dance rights and lefts across the dance and back again.

1st couple repeat dance with next 2 couples.

THE DASHING WHITE SERGEANT TUNE Original

This is a circle reel-time dance. Dancers stand in a circle bund the room in 3s. A man between 2 ladies faces a ray between 2 men. The man between 2 ladies moves gise and the other three counter-clockwise.



All six dancers make circle and dance left and 8 back 8 slip steps round to again.

The centre dances turns be right hand partner. They selve each other and turn with 2 hands, a pas de basque. Centre 2.34 al does the same ith left and finishes facing right hand dancer turns a hand partner, partner agains

17-24 They dang the reel of three, centre danger beginning the reel by giving left shoulder to right hand partner. 8 skip change of step. Shey flash facing their opposite 3.

25-82 All avance and retire then pass on to meet the next three coming towards them, passing 1512-16, right shoulder with the person opposite to them.

The dange is repeated as many times as you will.

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
