## FA P'TITS CHARS

(Quebec - Canada) · ·

This is a typical dance done in various regions of the province. "Ptit's chars" means little cars and especially little "tram cars" (once much in use in cities like Montreal). This contra dance form was taught by Normand Legault of Quebec City.

Rhythm: 2/4

Record: Any "reel" LARIDAINE 7801

LARIDAINE 7902 PHILO 2006 etc.

Formation: Two fairly long lines of couples in contra formations

(longways). Lines face head (front) of hall. W on M's R. Outside hands on shldr of person in front, inside

hand around partner's waist.

MEASURE	DESCRIPTION
* Note:	"Caller" may call dozens of possible figures always going back periodically to "chorus" (train) step
	CHORUS STEP
16	Everybody in "train" position takes 8 steps fwd. and 8 steps bkwd
	Possible figures
16	Women follow head lady and go in front of M down the set & back up the set on your side
16	Same as above but for men
16	Both lines go down the set on your own side and come back up (at the same time)
16	Face partner - everybody swing
16	" - Right elbow & left elbow turn
16	" - "Do-si-do"
	Progression figure
16	All cpls except first one makes an arch with partner. Head cpl dives under and goes to end of set etc.
