INTRODUCTION: none

PART I:

- 1-6 Move fwd in LOD with 6 two-steps
- $\frac{W}{N}$: Releasing L hands, W turn CW (R) once under joined R hands LRL.
- W: Move fwd to next M RLR.
- 7-8 Move continouously fwd with 2 two-steps (LRL-RLR), so that they may catch up with the next fwd W.
- 9-64 Repeat meas 1-8, 7 more times (8 times in all). End facing ctr.

PART II:

- 1-3 Cpls move twd ctr with 6 steps, beg L.
- Step L fwd (ct 1); tap R toe bkwd (ct &); hop on L while turning pivoting 1/2 (in own pos) to face out (ct 2). Do not release hands. W is now on ML side.
- 5-8 Repeat meas 1-4 moving away from ctr, beg R.

Repeat dance from beg to end of music.
