## (Bulgaria)

This dance is done by the "pomaks" (Bulgarian moslems) from the Western Rhodope region where it intersects with the Pirin Macedonian region. The dance is often referred to as a Sirto because of its similarity to the Greek syrto.

Rhythm: 7/8 counted here as 1-2-3, 1-2, 1-2 or 1, 2,3 (S-Q-Q) Formation: Mixed lines, "W" pos. Face slightly R of ctr, wt on L

Style: Somewhat heavy and proud

1	Step on R in LOD (1) step on L in LOD (2) step on R in LOD (3)	
2	Repeat pattern of meas 1 in same direction but starting with L	
3	Facing ctr, step on R to R (1) step on L in front of R (2) step on R in place (3)	•
4	Repeat pattern of meas 3 with opp direction and ftwrk	
5	Facing ctr, step fwd on R (1) step fwd on L (2) pause (3)	
6	Large step fwd on R with slight flexion (1) lift onto R, simultaneously bringing L behind R calf (2) pause (3)	
7	Step back from ctr onto L (1) step back onto R (2) pause (3)	
8	Step on L to L (1) turning to face LOD, step fwd on R (2) step fwd on L (3)	
	Dance repeats from beginning
