Note: I don't know the source of this dance. The chorus is a varient of a syrte Israeli style, done to hasaposerviko music. I have been told the music is by Aris San, a Greek-Israeli. The name is 'Sapiko" because in Hebrew, 'Ha" is a prefix meaning 'the', and therefore Hasapiko is thought by some Israelis to mean 'The Sapiko'.

Formation: Circle, holding hands, faming center, moving CCW

CHORUS:

- 1-2 : Step R ft to R side
- : Step L ft behind R
- 4 : Stop R ft to R side
- C+G : Step L It to R (sometimes preceeded by a quick preliminary hop on R ft)
- 7-8 : Turn R in 2 steps (L.L)
- 9-10 : Step R ft to R side, facing ctr again
- 11-12 : Cross L ft ofer R, and step back on R ft
- 13-16 : Repeat 9-12 opposite
 Repeat Chorus 3 more times

FIGURE I:

- 1 : Step R ft to R side
- 2 : Clap hands
- 3-4 : Step L ft to L side, and clap hands again
- 5-6 : Step R ft to R side
- 7-8 : 3 steps to R, starting crossing L ft over R

Repeat 3 more times

REPEAT CHORES

FIGURE II:

- 1-4 : Repeat Fig. I, 1-4
- 5 : Slight lesp on R ft to R side, but prepare for a L turn
- 6 : Slight leap on L ft to L side, starting a turn to the L. At the same time slap the R hand on the R foot
- 7-8 : Complete the turn with 2 more steps (P,L)
