TENNENGAUER BAYRISCH BAVARIAN FROM TENNENGAU.

"Bavarian" is a type of dance many variation of which are described by Karl Horak in his TIROLER TAENZE. K.H. is a well-known researcher in the field of folklore and now in retirement works diligently on his chosen task.

FORMATION: Couples in regular dance position on the line of the circle, M back to center

MEASURES

- 1 two step-close sideways in LOD
- 2 and two step-close sideways in RLOD
- 3-4 with four pivot steps turn twice CW
- 5 W turns once CW under his lifted left hand
- 6 joined hands swing once RLOD(in) once LOD(out)
- 7 clap once on own thighs then own hands and again thighs and hands
- 8 clap three times against partners' hands

THEN START THE DANCE FROM THE BEGINNING
