1&2& With a light hop on R ft, kick L ft diag. to the L (ct 1); jump both ft together (ct &). Repeat.

3&4& Same as 1&2& only using opp. ftwork.

Jump fwd with both ft together.

Jump bkwd with both ft together.

Jump 3 times in place (ct 1,&,2); hold (ct &).
