Milestone 100th birthday celebration for John Filcich August 9 – 11 at the Veteran's Memorial Hall in Arcata featured old time Kolo music played by Chubritza, John Morovich, a band from Oregon and all the musicians who ioined the Balkan Music Meet Up players. John told stories, led kolos and taught 3 dances. Other teachers included: Billy Burke, Jeff O'Conner and John Morovich. reviewed one or more of the kolos originally introduced to recreational folk

dance by John Filcich. Among the attendees were Jill & Jerry Duke, former director of the Kolo Fest who now reside in Montana. Members of the Humboldt Folk Dancers extended hospitality to numerous participants who arrived from Washington, Oregon and various corners of California. Everyone pitched in to set up and take down tables & chairs for delicious dinners, friendly sing-alongs, culture corners. Four great ideas I took away from the Filcich fest, marvelously organized by Jana Ashbrook (John's daughter):

FALL CAMP

FALLING IN LOVE WITH AUTUMN SINCE THE INCEPTION OF FALL CAMP

Early Friday afternoon November 22 teachers Genci Kastrati and Ira Weisburd, the executive committee, registrar Kelley O'Neill and volunteers will greet us campers at the secluded Brandeis-Bardin Campus of the American Jewish University in Simi Valley to begin a memorable weekend. Fall (the season, not the act of suddenly plunging to the ground from a standing position) Camp offers SoCal and "come from far-away" dancers the opportunity to re-connect in folklore, music, instruction, dancing and friendship. Jan and Marc Rayman assumed cochairmanship of the camp after Camp Hess Kramer was destroyed by fire and Irwin and Beverly Barr had retired from organizing events. Expect traditions & surprises

Nature walks, star gazing, Potluck Band, sing-alongs, Happy Hour, puzzles, poetry prompts, head wreaths and other colorful crafts will continue. Who

The number of participants is strictly limited to make sure folks can see the instructors and safely dance *Adama Ve Shamayim* and the *Hambo* at the evening parties. The drafty and sometimes sun scorched "barn" has been abandoned in favor of A/C and insulated walls in Wapner.

November weather in Simi Valley

Anything is possible—Indian summer or Arctic blast. I'll check the weather forecast on November 21 and be prepared with an umbrella and extra socks to walk between my room and Wapner if it rains. Nights will be cool (jacket, warm hat and pants needed for star gazing), days could be breezy (windbreaker) or sunny (visor). Rx for unpredictable weather–layers!

Director Terry Gucwa begins preparation months in advance. He chooses 6 songs that are singable and playable by amateurs, and, whenever possible, have a connection to the current Fall Camp Teachers. He arranges, perhaps simplifying, the written score to accommodate expected instruments and specifies pronunciation for the chorus to read. Just before camp he adjusts the score and unites talented campers into an inspired folk band to open the Saturday evening party. Bring your voice &/or tuba, *Cimbalom*, finger cymbals or other instruments. The resulting sound will be magical under Terry's guidance. Learning to play the trombone in high school was Terry's introduction to music. At Penn State he played in the Marching & Concert Band and also took part in Glee Club. During his school career Terry recognized that each instrument or voice was "lame" until united with every other person's part in a complex, fluid and interweaving relationship. [Paraphrased from information provided by Terry] Thus, he began to write arrangements and organize musical ensembles, a passion and expertise now appreciated by Fall Campers!

Professional Instruction of the highest caliber by master teachers

Additionally, Genci teaches at various academies in Tirana and presents workshops throughout Europe. Genci was introduced to recreational folk dance on the west coast at Stockton Camp 2015. He

brought Albanian dances to Laguna Fest in 2016 and to Lyrids Fest in 2023. Genci delighted virtual dancers when he presented Albanian Dances for the Folk Arts Center of New England in October 2021. Fall Camp 2024 will be a reunion for Genci with the many local dancers who have toured Albania and danced with him in his charming country. Add "scarves" to your packing list or purchase some at camp from Genci. Among our favorite Genci dances are *Kur Mi Zbrisje Shkallet*, about a stunning woman descending the stairs, and *Valle Çame e Shpejtë*, the fast dance of the Cham people.

Ira Weisburd, a Camp Hess Kramer 2007 & 2016 veteran, is making his debut at **Fall Camp**. It will be a reunion for Lee & Ira as they shared teaching in

2016 at Camp HK. Ira, a Florida resident, won the devotion of dancers around the world when he initiated virtual dance sessions on Facebook Live at the beginning of the



pandemic. Ira's YouTube channel skyrocketed from

17,000 to 63,000. Folks donated money in gratitude and Ira directed 50% of the funds to Doctors Without Borders and the Line Dance Foundation to assist dance instructors who had lost employment. Ira continues to lead virtual sessions that make it possible for distant dancers to participate. His dance videos are available for review <u>www.youtube.com/user/iraweisburd</u>. During his nearly 50 years as a dance maker Ira has created the step sequences for countless oft requested line and circle dances. "Sonata" to music sung by Eli and Fara won the award for best circle dance of the year in 2013. Is there any group that has not danced Ira's *"Cumbia Semana"* or *"W Moim Ogrodeczku?"* Music inspires his dance making. He listens, identifies the meter, uses traditional steps whenever possible and assembles satisfying step patterns. At Fall Camp Ira will present Balkan, International and Israeli dances. Among his other honors Ira received "Male Instructor of the Year" at the Vegas Dance explosion and the "Love of Dance" award. His early teachers—Dick Crum, Atanas Kolarovski, Mihai David, Yves Moreau, Bora Özkök, Theodor Vasilescu and David Henry— would be proud. Ira became "hooked" on folk dance while a student at University of Miami. He travels abroad frequently as a master teacher. When bouts of Sciatica disrupted his schedule Ira committed to doing the exercises he learned in PT on a regular basis. Good advice for all of us, Ira!

Enter the Queen of Treats--Bonnie Robinson



Returning campers will recall the years when AJU assumed responsibility for Happy Hour & Snacks with results beneath Fall Camp standards. In 2023 the rules changed. Bonnie took over and. voilà! Happy Hour is happy again. Bonnie amazingly orchestrates an ice cream social, refreshments at the Welcome Table and a Saturday afternoon pick-me-up snack break in addition to Happy Hour. Bonnie, the Refreshment Coordinator Extraordinaire for Laguna Fest, was surprised when Lee asked her to reprise that role at Fall Camp as she was not acquainted with the Simi Valley campus and its unique challenges. Her preparation for this role? OJT! During Bonnie's 40-year career as a literacy teacher she organized Pajama Nights, readers' theater events, ice cream socials, brunches, book signings, even a wedding dessert spread. Methodically Bonnie keeps notes, completes a post event evaluation for her records and

listens to folks express their preferences. She provides a variety of sweet and savory nibbles, fresh fruit and gluten free options. Her favorites? Juicy tangerine, fine chocolate and crunchy crackers with cheese. Purchasing and transporting then unloading all the required food requires enormous effort! Once food is at the Brandeis-Bardin campus it needs to be shuttled to the Wapner area. Additional volunteer labor is needed! Attendees who revel in socializing may choose to miss some of the Friday afternoon instruction to greet new arrivals at the Welcome Table and to re-plenish supplies. Does that describe you? 

1) Provide a Kids' room at festivals. In Arcata the kids' room was located near coffee & refreshment station so that the adult filling coffee carafe, etc. was available to impose order if needed. An easel plus art materials, games, toys, pillows, puzzles, apple sauce "squeezies" & popcorn were available to kids, who toted their personal digital game devices to the festival and also wandered into the hall to dance.

 Start every evening party with a musical jam to which anyone could join their voice or instrument.
 Prepare for the jam by having the musical director post music & lyrics on website in advance.

3) Conclude the festival on Sunday morning with a Bagel Bash, brief sing (and/or dance) along followed by reviews of festival dances. Folks will get up & show up for a social gathering with bagels, coffee & juice! At the Filcich fest there were no dance reviews so the sing & dance along joyfully continued all morning!

4) Offer registration on a sliding scale so that no dancer will be priced out of attending a party. The sliding scale would not apply to meals, tee shirts, etc. Also, admit at no cost any passerby who hears the music and walks through the door!

In Arcata Billy Burke demonstrated the teaching techniques he has honed through years of experience at LAUSD, and which he clearly articulates in his new book, *A Celebration of Diversity: Multicultural Experience Through the Art of Dance*, available for purchase on Amazon.
